Parents, thank you for supporting your son with learning at home.

I'm encouraged by our students' engagement with online learning, recognising that it can often be challenging to juggle Google Classrooms and Zoom in the home setting. I'm hoping you're also finding ways to enjoy the experience – there are lots of fun ways to learn without technology. Our priorities are helping your son stay connected to school and learning while we have stay-at-

home restrictions are in place. It's really important that he is taking this opportunity to read: reading every day and challenging himself to read more complex texts.

Did you know your son can borrow e-books through our library?


ALL Students in **Year 7-10 borrowing limit has been increased from 2 books to 4 books and** Year 11 and 12 to 6 books. This will allow ALL STUDENTS to borrow additional eBooks OR an AUDIO BOOK from the Oliver Library while at home.

ALL existing books loans for students Years 7-12 have been renewed until 16th August. There is no need to return a physical book to school during the lockdown period.

Our ACCELERATED READING PROGRAM is available online



Students in Years 7 to 9 should be reading an Accelerated Reader book every day for at least 20 minutes. Students should have their AR book and their AR logbook to record their reading. It's important that students are following through with the daily reading. A routine is the best way for example:

1. Students READ for 20 minutes each morning

at the beginning of Period 1.

- 2. At the end of the 20 minutes, they **record what they have read in their logbook**. Parent/guardian signs the reading log.
- 3. Students share what they have read with a family member at home and with their teacher/ librarian during Wide Reading lessons.
- 4. Once the book has been read, students complete their AR quiz online.



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PLEASE NOTE: All students are able to access their AR quizzes from home. There is a time constraint to complete a quiz from 8:30AM to 5:30PM, Monday to Friday. (Students cannot complete a quiz on a weekend.)

Online security is paramount



I've had a number of discussions this week with parents and students about digital security – particularly about **keeping passwords safe**.

Everyone knows not to share their passwords – but it still happens!

Please have this discussion with your son, so that they say 'no' if someone, including their friend, asks them to share it, for whatever reason.


