As Mr. Dummett reminds us, attendance is a high priority at CBHS.


Every day matters.

If your son needs to be away from school, a valid reason needs to be provided on the day or within seven days at the latest. The principal is

responsible for accepting or declining the justification for the absence.



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Acceptable reasons include:

- Sickness. Where the sickness extends beyond three days, please provide a medical certificate.
- Misadventure / an unforeseen significant event
- Recognised religious festivals or ceremonial occasions including Sorry Business
- Significant special events, not related to the school e.g. Citizenship Ceremony
- Domestic necessity, such as a serious illness of an immediate family member

Please note that an explanation of traffic problems is not a justifiable reason according to the Department of Education. We encourage our students to factor in traffic / transport delays when setting their alarm clocks.

Families are encouraged to holiday or travel during school vacations rather than during term. Similarly, we encourage families to make medical appointments outside of school hours wherever possible.

Having pride in our school – wearing our uniform with pride

We're a uniform school, so we expect that all uniform requirements such as school winter jackets and jumpers will be worn by every student. You can buy our **winter jacket**, **school blazer** and **beanie** from the school office. Non-school hoodies aren't accepted as part of the uniform and aren't to be worn.

Here's to a fantastic year ahead—let's keep up the momentum and make 2025 a year of growth, learning, and success.



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














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



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SCIENCE






Year 8








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Planning My Future Career

Students in Year 9 and 10 have the opportunity to participate in Work Experience, if you have contacts or ideas for places they could go, now is the









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
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
